TASK 1 This term Perspectives Magazine explores what it means to be part of the world: connecting to others, standing up for what you believe in, and having the right to be seen and valued.



Create a short text to answer this question:

Who do you look to as a role model to teach you how to be a part of the world? Explain and give reasons for your answer. Include at least one example from the magazine. Give your text a title.

TASK 2 Read the article

- In what way is this article connected to the topic part of the world? Explain using your own words.
- In your opinion, what role could social media play in moments like the one described in the article?



TASK 3 This term Perspectives Magazine finds out about footballer Marcus Rashford and his work to make sure that no child goes hungry in his country. Create a short text to tell Rashford what you think of his work. Your text may be in the form of a video post on social media, a social media comment, or a text message. Make sure to use at least one example from the article and to include your own reactions and thoughts.



Task 4 In Perspectives Magazine, you read about challenges that we face, personally and globally: how to be a good person, the pandemic, poverty, and how to protect the environment.

Create your own text about how to make a difference – big or small – for other people and for the world. You may take inspiration and use information from the magazine, and from what you have learnt in school or from other sources, but be sure to mostly use your own imagination, ideas, opinions, or experiences. Choose an interesting title and a suitable type of text, such as a short story, an opinion, a speech, a podcast episode, a blog post, a diary or a letter.



TASK 5 In this issue of Perspectives Magazine, you have read the text “Where I’m from”. In the poem, Vanita Sharma explores her background and everything that makes up her world. Inspired by this poem, **create your own text about your background and what makes up your world.** You may take inspiration and use information from the magazine, and from what you have learnt in school or from other sources, but be sure to mostly use your own imagination, ideas, opinions, or experiences. Choose an interesting title and a suitable type of text, such as a short story, a long poem, an opinion, a news article, a speech, a podcast episode, a blog post, a diary, a video, or a story written in the form of text messages.
